The deck in the zero turn is binding somewhere so the you have to add a little weight to get it down. I have looked at it a couple times and tried a few fixes but nothing has worked yet. It will not hurt the mower to operate like this just put your foot on when you let it down to mow until I get it figured out. I plan to call a tech at Kubota this week to see what there suggestion is to fix it.

One last thing. I would like to thanks to everyone for showing up and helping with mowing. This is the biggest chore we have to maintain the field. It is great to show up at a scheduled work day and see everyone working together to make this chore easy and enjoyable.

(The Secretary's Report)

President Keith Jarvis called the meeting to order

The April minutes were accepted unanimously

There was 1 visitor.

Vice President Buddy Barnett reported that the field is in good condition and that the grass is growing. Buddy asks that everyone help with the mowing. The next mowing will be at 10:00 AM on Friday (5/5). Mowing is now delayed until 10:00 AM so that the grass has time to dry.

A new Member (Brandon Phillips) was voted in by all members except one. Welcome Brandon.

The club would like to thank Don Bonnette for using his pressure washer and washing the concrete in the pavilion. It looks great.

Max told members that the zero-turn mower has a problem with the hydraulics for the mower deck. Buddy will look into it.

Treasurer Sam Barrett reported that the club finances are in good condition. The club might have made a small profit on "Big Bird" and he will know better when he examines the club finances. Sam also reported that the club has used about a third of the allotted field maintenance budget for the year.

There is an issue with the water at the field and it is being worked on. Members should not drink the water at the field until further notice.

Secretary Larry Bonnette told members that the weather station was down last week because of a faulty battery that was caused by a bad switch. Larry repaired the switch problem and charged the battery. All should be good now.

Safety Officer Kris Jeffcote reported that he observed some over flight of our neighbor's property. Members are asked to keep their aircraft over the field. Kris has been in contact with the neighbor. Kris also reported that the fire extinguishers have been checked and that the first aid kit will be replenished. He will also replace the pads on the de-fibular since they are now expired.

The club has a firm quote on the metal siding for the club house. The quote is \$5000 for the entire job (all materials and installation).

A motion was made and seconded to spend \$5000 on the metal siding. The motion passed with a vote of 32 to one. One member would rather see a new building. Keith agreed about the new building but the club can't afford that right now. Members should think about how they would like to see the club house improved in the future. Keith said we will re-visit this at a later meeting.

Gary Baumgartner reported that he found all of the building unlocked when he arrived at the field on 5/4. Members are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure that all club property is properly secured before leaving for the day. The last one out should always check that everything is locked.

Gary volunteered to collect old hobby magazines at our club meetings to distribute to Jr high schools, and Libraries. If you would like to donate your old magazines bring them to the meeting and hand them to Gary.

Someone asked if the Club Class Pattern event was going to occur in May. No one knew. So, we will assume it is canceled.

The club will host a group of approximately 15 Cub Scouts at the field on Saturday June 10 at 4:30 PM. Club volunteers will provide aircraft and expertise to allow the scouts a chance to fly. If members would like to help out please show up with any aircraft you own that can be used. Rain date for the event will be Sunday June 11.

The club has been asked to participate at the Madero Air Show at the Conroe Airport on June 2,3 and 4. Keith Jarvis will be our representative.

Gary Baumgartner told the club that he participated in an event called "Challenge Air" and it was very well attended. Challenge Air was created to change the perception of children with special needs through the gift flight.

Aron Hopper sent the club a thank you card for the funds he received from the clubs helping hands donation.

A reminder that the first annual "War Birds" event will be on June 24 See Buddy for details. Buddy will send Larry a PDF to post on the web site.

Keith asked for members to volunteer for the open committee positions. Don Ramsey volunteered to be the Grievance committee chairman. Kirk Jensen and Buddy Barnett volunteered to be members of the Grievance committee.

Big Bird was successful even with the high winds. Buddy Barnett's wife Cherese and Keith Jarvis's wife Trisha did a great job managing the kitchen and providing great tasting food and drink. The club thanks them. The club also thanks all the members who helped to make the event a successful one.

Club members discussed the construction of the tables in the pavilion. Herbert Newsom explained the diagram that he drew up. The plan is to remove $\frac{1}{2}$ of the radio impound and bolt tables permanently to the floor. The work will begin shortly. Club members are asked to help out. The Treasurers Report

It is May 2017 and we have made our 18th payment on the runway; only 42 more to go. The treasury is in good shape as we enter the warmer weather, and the field maintenance picks up, to cover all our normal maintenance expenses. We also have several maintenance or capital projects proposed or approved which will require thousands in funding; as previously reported, I do not see any problem at this point in supporting those recently proposed.

Despite some really unkind weather and an even worse weather forecast, Big Bird 2017 turned out surprisingly well. In the face of winds in excess of 20 mph and some gusts of 30+, Scotty Harris was the first pilot in official event time to hit the air and amaze the crowd with flying that defied the winds. Our VP, Buddy Barnett followed close behind with his big bi-plane with smoke trails to match those of Scotty and the event

was well underway. As much as we could complain, we had better than forecast weather and our club members really put in the effort to make the event an enjoyable success. Much of the enjoyment thanks to the great concession service provided by Trisha Jarvis, Cherese Barnett and their children. The assortment of food and drink options was very nice and service with a smile; you couldn't get any better. This kind of support from member families really helps our club events and we owe the ladies and their families a big, Thank You!

As we get into the warmer weather we need to remember that any air conditioners, chargers and lights used at the field should be checked and turned off when locking up and leaving the field. Also remember to spin those lock dials after opening the gate and clubhouse so the combination is not displayed to non-members. Doing these simple things will save us utility expense and protect us from theft or unauthorized use of our field by non-members. Lastly when leaving the field, cleanup trash or food items you brought to the field and take them with you. Not much of the trash to be found at the field got there by itself. In addition to being unsightly and making extra work for our mowing crews, the debris can attract scavengers looking for food, along with their droppings and digging. Leave the field at least as clean as you found it and report to a club officer any condition you feel is not up to our expectations.

As ever, we have paid-up members who need to renew their AMA and should not be flying until they do. Please take time to check your AMA member status and do not fly until you have a current AMA card or evidence on you that confirms your AMA coverage is current. Fly safe and fly AMA covered and we will all be happier.
