key garage project this winter was to build a holder for my larger planes that would be more secure than standing them up by the nose cone

and way to make it easier to move many planes at one time. Did some

searching on the web and found a video of a rolling rack someone made that stacked multiple planes stored in a horizonal position. I used the info as a template but modified the dimensions and materials to suit what I had on hand and materials was available near the house. Looked at using pine but the board quality was very poor so I went with 2"x2" cedar. Great wood to work with but it sure did drive up the cost of the rack significantly. The base is about 2.5' x 4' and the vertical rack is about 6' tall. Casters are on the 4 corners so it can be moved and heavy duty dual track allow adjustment of the positions to match various plane sizes. It has turned out to be a much better way to store the planes and helps when I need to access space in the garage. The photo shows it right after I finished it and loaded it up. Hope you have used the winter months to get your stuff ready or found interesting projects to keep yourself occupied.

Then, display your AMA while flying to assure that it is current and that your name is visible to other club members. Also, take time to review the club and AMA flying rules, posted at the field.

In the not too distant future, the heat will be upon us. Don't forget to help out the treasury by using lights and air conditioning responsibly. Please check the clubhouse to determine that A/C units and lights are turned off and that any outside lights on the covered pavilion are off. Electric rates are increasing and we need to keep control over our costs of utilities. Also, keep restrooms and clubhouse locked and that if you are the last to leave the field, it is a duty to ensure all doors and field gates equipped with a lock, are secured.
